- **What happened:**
 1. Visit of the Löwentor Museum and the construction site of Stuttgart 21.
 2. Visiting the regional NABU headquarter.

Procedure and insights

Expectation: Visualizing environmental problems in a German city. Studying the historic consequences of climate change and extinction of species in the Löwentor Museum.

Presenting the organization structure of an environmental club.

Procedure: By arriving at the Stuttgart main train station, it was directly possible to visit the construction site of Stuttgart21. A good overview over the traffic and transport issues as well as the climate situation in Stuttgart was obtained from the old tower of the station building.

Travel to the museum was by local tram and inside the museum the implications of historic climate changes were examined.

Finally, the organization structure of the NABU was presented at its regional headquarter in the city center.
